We began with a short presentation on The Elms, a stately mansion situated on the old carriage road along the west bank of the Patapsco River just south of the present day Rt. 140 bridge over Liberty Reservoir. The house was built in approximately 1760 and at one time belonged to the son of Francis Scott Key. It was destroyed when the Liberty Reservoir was constructed, but some still remember this fine old Maryland home. The Carroll County Media Center recorded the meeting and will air the recording on cable channel 23.
