► Finksburg Corridor Plan: (More Information) THE PLAN IS UP FOR A 60 DAY REVIEW, Starting 4/16/2013:

A public hearing on the plan is scheduled for May 29, 2013. A community meeting took place 4/3/2013, 6 PM at the Finksburg Library. The main change made to the plan in this last version is: the land use change, from Conservation to Commercial, for the property at the NE quadrant of Md. 140/Md. 91 (Cedarhurst area). The Finksburg community was invited to this informational meeting on proposed modifications to the Draft Finksburg Corridor Plan, a document that sets goals and guides development along the eastern portion of the Maryland Route 140 corridor in Carroll County. A prior meeting was Monday, January 14, 2013 at 6:00 pm at the Sandymount United Methodist Church, 2101 Old Westminster Pike, Finksburg.

Staff from the County's Department of Land Use, Planning & Development provided an overview of plan modifications and members of the County Planning Commission were available for a question and answer session.

The plan is an update to the 1981 Finksburg Area and Environs Comprehensive Plan and focuses on traffic flow in the corridor, protecting the area's environmental resources, and eliminating the growth area designation from the area outside the Route 140 corridor. Copies also are available for review at the Finksburg library and at the Department of Planning (Room 205).

The Finksburg Corridor Plan has been in the making for over 10 years. There have been numerous changes, starts and stops along the way. The *incredible* journey and timeline of this plan is documented here.

►MD 140 Bridge at Baltimore County Line, Set For 2 Year Repair:

The Baltimore Regional Transportation Board is currently welcoming comments on an amendment to the Baltimore regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the MD 140 Bridge over the North Branch of the Patapsco River Bridge Project. This amendment would provide \$6.8 million in funding for the rehabilitation of this bridge, built in the mid-1940's. An open house style public meeting took place on Wednesday, April 10 from 5 to 7 p.m. at the Carroll County Public Library - Finksburg Branch. The State Highway Administration will hold a public informational meeting about the project on May 21, from 6 to 7:15 p.m. at Sandymount Elementary School at 2222 Old Westminster Pike in Finksburg. The May 21 meeting will include a presentation with detailed information about the project design and plans for maintaining traffic across the bridge during the project. Those with questions about the project and how it will affect traffic are encouraged to attend. The District Engineer for Carroll County also sent information to the Carroll County Elected Officials about both meetings.

54,000 vehicles cross this bridge daily in and out of Finksburg. Traffic will be impacted for an estimated two years! Construction is to start in the fall of 2013 and should be complete by Spring 2015.
